Dear Senator,

On behalf of the nearly 300,000 active and retired members of the National Association of Letter Carriers, I write in opposition to S. 1383, the SAVE America Act.

This bill would make it harder for U.S. citizens to vote by requiring a valid passport or a certified copy of a birth certificate when registering to vote or updating voter registration. Tens of millions of Americans do not have passports. These changes will disproportionately affect American workers, lower-income citizens, and married women who change their names.

NALC opposes these measures and any effort to suppress voting rights. Letter carriers are proud of our work, which allows tens of millions of Americans to participate in our democracy through vote-by-mail.

Related to vote-by-mail, S. 1383 includes a dangerous, unnecessary provision that would reject mail-in ballots unless a form of identification is included. This would make an already reliable, preferred and protected process more difficult. Nearly 1 in 3 Americans voted by mail in 2024, and letter carriers safely and securely delivered nearly 100 million ballots to and from voters.

Any insinuation that voting by mail is unsafe or insecure is severely misguided and inaccurate. The SAVE America Act undermines the validity of mail-in voting while aiming to suppress U.S. citizens' voting rights.

NALC opposes S. 1383 and urges you to vote "no" when it is considered in the Senate.
